

## Minutes of September 10, 2013 OHMHA Meeting

Board Members Present: Jack Cederquist, David Bizot, Emily Eisbruch, Frank Commiskey, Peter Mooney, Greg Jagst, Anne Karabakal, Jerry Schulte, Amy Seetoo, Rabia Shafie

1. **Minutes.** The Board voted on and approved unanimously minutes from the following prior meetings:  
  
May 14 – David Bizot moved Greg Jagst seconded  
May 31 – Jerry Schulte moved David Bizot seconded  
June 3 – Amy Seeto moved Rabia Shafie seconded.
2. **Fall Festival.** The board discussed the upcoming Fall Festival. Greg Jagst mentioned the following points
  - a. The Leslie Science Center will not have their eagle this year.
  - b. Mike Conboy will once again do a tree tour.
  - c. Tom Teller will provide musical entertainment throughout.
3. **Council Forum.** The proposed 2<sup>nd</sup> Ward candidates' forum was discussed. Pete Mooney indicated that he had reached out to the 3 candidates – Jane Lumm, Kirk Westphal and Conrad Brown. Westphal and Brown have expressed interest. Greg moved and Jerry seconded \$100.00 to cover expenses. The board unanimously approved.
4. **The Great Wall of Georgetown.** The Georgetown Entrance Wall was discussed. Pete Mooney and Jerry Schulte discussed a possible questionnaire to be used to gauge neighbors' opinions at the Fall Festival. Jerry said that he would see if he can find someone to prepare drawings of proposed solutions.
5. **Woodbury Apartments.** Frank Commiskey said that this project was under review by City staff, and would be coming up before Planning Commission on September 17.
6. **Burbank entrance bush.** Pete Mooney discussed bids obtained for a replacement bush. The board approved Jay's Unique Landscaping's bid on the condition that he provide a warranty and the bid was in writing on a motion by David Bizot seconded by Frank Commiskey. There has since been continued discussion via email about other options.
7. **Thurston Nature Center.** Frank discussed some of the projects the TNC is involved in in conjunction with Thurston Elementary, including a vegetable garden, putting up bird houses and composting. TNC will have neighborhood events in the Spring.
8. **The Natural Area Preservation work day.** Jack discussed that the Sugarbush work day had a large turnout. Approximately 17 people came out whereas in other neighborhoods the average is 5.
